### High School Cafeteria Upgrade!

#### PURPOSE:

This project is to remodel the high school campus cafeteria to create a "food court" atmosphere. This atmosphere will be more appealing to this high school student population. Several years ago, our department had to let our extension room & serving kitchen become an art room for students. We suddenly had to serve over 300 students in one room! Ha. However, with The Smarter Lunchrooms Movement techniques, we were able to make this happen safely and successfully.

The purpose of this remodel and transformation will be to increase access to the meals for students, as well as increase participation in the School Breakfast Program and the National School Lunch Program. We often experience that the high school student population makes personal choices to skip meals for reasons that may be health related, personal, or social.

By creating a space on campus utilizing some of the Smarter Lunchroom techniques, students will be able to choose delicious and nutrition options that continue to help students manage portion sizes and enact healthy choices. This new food court design for a very small serving area, will increase efficiency & convenience. Therefore increasing access and improving service for up to 700+ students.

School site administration will help cross-promote the school cafeteria and encourage students to participate in the school meal programs. So that they can perform their best inside and outside of the classroom, learn optimally and develop social-emotional wellbeing.

As part of this project, meal counts will be compared to before and after the cafeteria transformation to show the benefits of the remodel.
