

Child & Family Outcomes: What We Know

Families are nurturing and stable

- Most children's basic needs for food and housing are met
- Most families meet children's safety needs
- Many families are not connected to the traditional medical system

Children and healthy and successful

- Student achievement is lower than the state average
- 4-year graduation rates are higher than the state average
- Mental health needs are high

Fewer system-involved youth (Child Welfare and Juvenile Justice)

- Rate of child maltreatment is decreasing
- Children in need of foster care are more frequently placed with relatives or extended family
- Probation is matching youth needs to lower level interventions

Child & Family Outcomes: What We Don't Know

Do children and teens get enough sleep?

Do families seek support in times of need?

Do young children get support if developmental milestones are not met?







Conditions for Raising Children in Santa Barbara County

Community well-being influences children's health and success

Five interdependent drivers:

- Economic stability
- Access to quality health care
- Access to quality education
- Social and community context
- Neighborhood and built environment

Prevention

Primary

Programs that support before children are exposed to potentially harmful experiences


Secondary

Services targeted to families in need to alleviate problems and prevent escalation

Tertiary

Intervention for children experiencing maltreatment and youth who commit crimes

Critical Needs

- Address workforce shortages
- Build data infrastructure
- Emphasize positive childhood experiences





Recommendations to the County Board of Supervisors

- Maximize opportunities to improve families' economic stability
- Ensure County departments use "no wrong door" approach
- Increase investment in North County, where needs are greatest
- Address workforce issues at a county level
- Adopt data infrastructure across County departments

Recommendations for Community Partners

- Understand that many families are losing access to services and supports
- Stress within families may make it hard for children to learn and self-regulate
- Positive experiences and supportive relationships are critical
- Do your best to support one another and offer smiles when you can
- Learn about the services in your community and stay abreast of changes
- Honor the resilience and fortitude that has grown from the past
